Institutions: how to apply to EACEA

- Register all partners in a proposal within the participants portal
- Complete the electronic application form and attach annexes required
- Submit the electronic application

Institutions: then what happens?

- **All proposals are assessed by independent experts**
- **Proposals are ranked according to their assessed quality**
- **The best proposals are selected for funding by the European Commission**
- **All candidates are informed, and results are published**
- **Contracts are prepared for successful projects**

- Apply direct to the project consortium offering the Master
- Lists on EACEA website

Who does what?

European Commission, EACEA

European Commission

- Sets policy, priorities, targets and manages budget
- Guides and monitors implementation

Education, Audiovisual and Culture Executive Agency (EACEA)

- Manages life-cycle of E+ centralised actions
- Promotion – selection – contracting - monitoring

National Agencies in the EU

- **Promote and implement programme at national level**
- **Link between EC and local participating organisations**

National Erasmus+ Offices

In Partner Countries concerned:

- **Focal point for stakeholders in Erasmus+ higher education activities, including:**
- **Information – advice – monitoring – support for events and policy dialogue**

EU Delegations

- **The "eyes, ears and mouthpiece of the European Union" in over 130 countries**
- **Source of information and guidance on all EU policies, including Erasmus+**

EMA: Erasmus Mundus Student & Alumni Association

- **Promotes networking with other scholarship-holders**
- **Tips and guidance to selected / potential students**
- **Employment advice to alumni**
- **Theme-related events or studies**
- **Country / regional representatives or chapters**
