



## Erasmus+ Programme **Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degrees** Key Action 1: Learning mobility of Individuals

### **What is it?**

A Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degree (EMJMD) is a highly integrated international master programme of 60, 90 or 120 ECTS (1-2 years), selected and supported by the European Commission, developed and delivered by a consortium of at least 3 EU universities, including if relevant non-EU universities. Studies should take place in at least two different Programme Countries<sup>1</sup>, that lead to the award of fully recognised joint or multiple degrees. Every year, new Master degrees are selected and added to the catalogue of all EMJMDs that are still open for scholarships.

### **How does it work?**

Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degrees provide full scholarships to excellent students worldwide to cover travel costs, participation costs and living costs during the entire duration of the Master course. Students from all nationalities, having completed their Bachelor Degrees, must first apply to the Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degree (EMJMD) of their choice through the website of the relative consortium. Only students who are selected to take part in an EMJMD organised under the Erasmus+ programme may receive these scholarships.

Each year, around 15 students are selected to take part per EMJMD programme and a minimum of 75% of the scholarships are earmarked for candidates from Partner Countries<sup>2</sup>.

A student can apply to up to three Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degree programmes in one selection year.

### **How is it funded?**

A student, who is accepted in one of the EMJMDs, will receive a full scholarship covering his/her tuition, travel and living costs. He/she will be covered by health and accident insurance.

### **How can a Lebanese student apply?**

A Lebanese student, like every other student, should directly apply to the website of the consortium offering the desired Master degree chosen from the catalogue of open EMJMDs. Once accepted as an Erasmus Master student, he/she will receive the scholarship.
